WSJT by W9RAY

WSJT is the name of a computer program. It stands for "Weak Signal Communications, by K1JT." The first mode implemented, and the one that has given WSJT its wide popularity, is called FSK441. It is designed for high speed meteor scatter (HSMS) communication using "pings" reflected from the under dense ionization trails of random meteors at approximately 100 km height. Such pings are typically a few dB above the noise and last for anywhere from ten to a few hundred milliseconds. QSOs can be successful with modest equipment and without waiting for "band openings." W9RAY has had good success on 6 meters with the 5 element yagi and 70 watts out. And some success on 2 meters with 8 element yagi and 90 watts, with both antennas up 15 feet in the city. Contacts from 400-1200 miles have been made on "dead" bands any time of the day in less than a half hour. 6 meters is much easier than 2 meters. WSJT/JT44 mode. New version 1.9.4 just released on 03-22-02 Lets you copy signals -18db below noise for EME/Tropo use. It is still in Beta stage of development. Program is available free from the author Joe K1JT at http://pulsar.princeton.edu/~joe/K1JT/ (you need the whole program) The update files are here:
